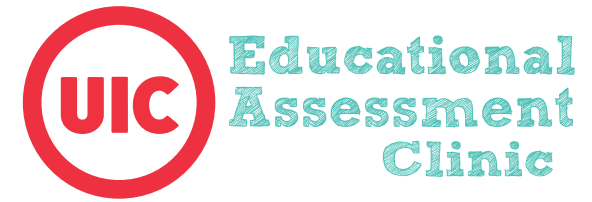
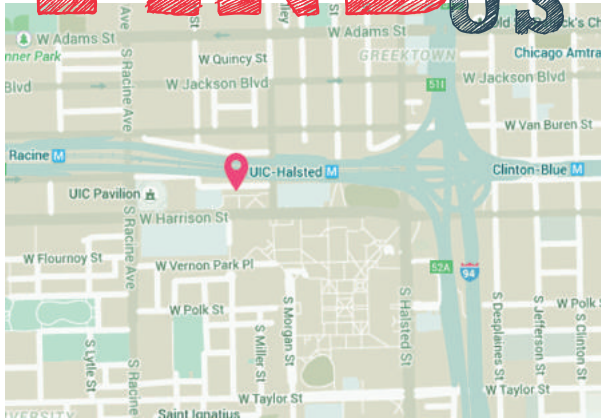


WHERE TO FIND US

UIC Educational Assessment Clinic

Exploring children's learning needs.

OUR CLINIC

serves both the community and future special education teachers.

GOALS:

1 To help children and their families gain a fuller understanding of their child's learning profile of strengths and needs to seek more targeted support and services at school.



To train future special education teachers in evaluation procedures in preparation for one role as diagnosticians.

METHOD:

In order to gain a full understanding of the child, the evaluation includes collecting a variety of information through interviews and observations as well as formal and informal testing.

Each evaluation is individualized according to the child's needs. Under the supervision of our Clinic Director & Instructor, interns complete the assessments, analyze the information to create a learning profile, and make educational recommendations for use in the home and at school.

ASSESSMENTS INSTRUMENTS

Some of the instruments used are:
Woodcock-Johnson III - Tests of Cognition Achievement • Key Math 3 • Clinical Eval. of Fundamentals, 5th Ed. • Test of Written Language, 4th Ed. • Informal Reading Inventory • Slingerland Screening Tests for Specific Language Disabilities • Affective Scales (Connors, Piers-Harris, SSIS, SMALSI) • Informal Assessments

TIME COMMITMENT

Clients are required to attend all 6 two-hour sessions. Evaluations are scheduled three times per year in line with UIC's semesters. In the fall (Oct) and spring (Mar), sessions are held on Saturday mornings. In the summer (June/July), sessions meet 1-2 days per week across four weeks.

SERVICES

Each evaluation includes:

1. formal written case study report describing the child's learning profile, indicating if the child fits the profile of disability.
2. parent/child meeting to discuss results w/ handout of the child's learning profile.
3. feedback video to the child describing his/her learning profile with ideas to improve.

COST

The fee for the assessment clinic is \$350. Payment plans and a sliding scale option is available.
